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## Transportation Guidelines

The recent tragic event in Kalamazoo, MI involving an Uber driver serves as a grim reminder of the importance of RH's transportation policy.

Student safety is the most important responsibility of our staff and our host parents. For this reason, we do not allow students to utilize smartphone app-based transportation services. Their regulatory process is not acceptable for our students because background checks are not conducted to the highest level of security. Additionally, is not legal for individuals under the age of 18 to activate and maintain user accounts with Uber and ride share programs. Drivers for these services are not required to ask the age of passengers and many do not guestion individuals who are clearly minor children.

If a host parent is unable to provide transportation for a student to an extra-curricular activity or airport, arrangements should be made with another RH approved driver, a reputable taxi or shuttle service or by contacting Mr. Wengian Jin, who is approved by RH. Student Advisors are available to help.

## 2 Sanford Students Win Scholastic Awards

Congratulations to RH's Karida Liu on winning two Silver Key Awards for her "Transition" and "EMOJI" Comic Art. Congratulations also to Ruilin Yang for receiving an Honorable Mention for her Personal Essay. More than 90,000 seventh through twelfth graders across the country submitted work to the annual Scholastic Artists and Writers competition, which is sponsored by the Scholastic Corporation and presented by the nonprofit Alliance for Young Artists and Writers. Art work is judged by industry leaders and exhibited in New York City and at local exhibitions around the country. Karida and Ruilin were two of 33 Sanford students who won top awards. "For most young winners," the Corporation has stated, "this recognition is their first experience of being identified as serious artists and writers, and the impact on their self-perception can be life-changing."

The awards showcased the diverse talents of Sanford's artists, as students were recognized for work in eleven different categories: Ceramics & Glass, Sculpture Art, Photography, Digital Art, Painting, Fashion, Editorial Cartoon, Comic Art, Film & Animation, Drawing & Illustration, and Mixed Media. Sanford students earned nine "Gold Key" awards, sixteen "Silver Keys," and seventeen "Honorable Mentions." Work earning Gold and Silver Key recognitions was exhibited at the Art Gallery at Delaware State University in Dover from January 22nd through February 6th.


