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Upcoming Exploration of The Franklin Institute

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
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Renascentia Hall has planned a day trip to The Franklin Institute in Philadelphia, PA on Saturday March 15, 2014. Students, their friends, and host families are invited to enjoy this day in the City of Brotherly Love exploring the museum and Chinatown. The day will begin with a presentation in the Fells Planetarium entitled *To Space and Back*. This



technologically advanced Planetarium show is an extraordinary story of human ingenuity and incredible engineering that describes how the technology that transports us through space is used for devices and applications we use every day.

A viewing of the 3-D movie, *Mummies: Secrets of the Pharaohs*, will also be included in the tour. The film follows researchers and explorers as they piece together the archeological and genetic clues of Egyptian mummies. Scientists today are reconstructing mummy DNA and deciphering ancient texts to gain insight into modern human genetics and advance medical treatments.



Attendees will also view the popular exhibit, *One Day in Pompeii*, which tells the remarkable tale of the city that vanished under thick ash when Mount Vesuvius erupted in the year 79 A.D. Pompeii was hidden from view and forgotten for centuries until its rediscovery over 250 years ago. The artifacts on display are set in their original surroundings, offering an insider's glimpse into

this ancient Roman city. As the floors shake and the walls rumble, audiences will experience the volcano's catastrophic eruption through immersive computerized graphic images and witness the devastation left in its path.

The schedule for the day allows some time for shopping and dinner in Chinatown. Host families will receive a flyer by email with instructions for reserving a seat for the trip.

NAIS Conference

A snow storm in Delaware didn't stop staff members Jerry Xiao and Clarice Kwasnieski from attending the National Association of Independent Schools (NAIS) Conference on February 27-28 in Orlando, Florida. The event was held at the Walt Disney



World Dolphin Resort with more than 3,200 attendees. School administrators and faculty members in attendance learned about advances in education through general sessions, workshops and presentations. In the Exhibit Hall, 220 vendors displayed products and services related to education and school administration. "It was a whirlwind trip," explained Clarice. "We left Wednesday to set-up our booth before the event opened on Thursday. The exhibit area closed Friday afternoon and we were back in Delaware that evening." The two spoke directly to representatives from more than 25 schools interested in adding or expanding their international student program. Summer Program

The Renascentia Hall Summer Program will provide international students from age 10 to 16 with an opportunity to have some fun while learning about life in America. Students will attend a day camp at an area school and will spend evenings with their host family. Renascentia Hall will organize weekend day trips to allow exploration of schools, museums, historical sights and other points of interest. This short-term program will introduce American culture and food to students to ease their transition to studying at a U.S. high school. For the Summer Program, the single bedroom requirement is waived to accommodate two students being housed in one bedroom. A stipend will be paid to host families to cover housing, food, and daily transportation to the camp.

On Saturday, March 1, 2014, Renascentia Hall students gathered at the Newark Community Center in Newark, Delaware to participate in the Youth Leadership Workshop #2. The theme of the workshop was "Communication and Working in
